- Sharing by lay leaders and clerics emphasize piety, study, and action, and connect Biblical principles to the realities of human hearts and experiences.


One of the principles of **DeColores Ministries** is that we focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be.

A Brief History

DeColores Ministries has its roots in the Cursillo Movement, which began with the Catholic Church in Spain in 1949. As the movement grew in popularity, efforts were started to make the Cursillo experience available to all Christians.

DeColores Ministries began as an ecumenical form of the Cursillo method. Many of the Spanish traditions remain, but there is no direct affiliation with Cursillo. The word DeColores literally means "of colors" and refers to the many colors of God's love and grace through Christ
